Dear Colleague

The Foundation celebrated its 45th year of service to dermatology in 2009, and we cannot help but reflect on the critical role it has played in the development of the specialty. Since its start, the Foundation has consistently identified, introduced and launched the careers of outstanding potential leaders in dermatology—including many of today's experts and key contributors. Bringing the specialty's brightest minds to the forefront and giving them a foundation on which to grow has enabled the specialty to flourish, and is now essential to keeping dermatology at the cutting edge of all of medicine. The DF has also provided the dermatologic community and industry a pathway to express their support for the evolution of the specialty. The high level of involvement of both practicing dermatologists and our industry partners is extraordinary, and is a testament to the value each has placed on the DF's mission.

As we end this year and begin another, we wish to express the Trustees' deep appreciation to the Foundation's many physician members, and industry and society partners who maintained their commitment to the advancement of the specialty and gave generously in 2009.

While other philanthropic organizations reported double-digit losses, individual and industry contributions to the DF decreased by only 2.9% and 6.5%, respectively. These positive results enabled the Trustees to award \$3.0 million in research support to 65 talented and promising new physician-scientists and investigators this year for projects covering the entire spectrum of dermatology.

The Trustees recognize that the year ahead will continue to hold challenges for our newest generation of teachers and researchers seeking early career research support. The limited availability of research dollars, combined with economic uncertainty, pose real obstacles for those just starting their academic careers.

This year, we invite every dermatologist to join us and help

address the need for research funding. Giving back to keep our profession progressive should be a priority for every dermatologist and supporting the Dermatology Foundation makes this easy. With our collective support, the DF can ensure that those who have the greatest potential to contribute to dermatology have the opportunity to pursue advances in all areas of the specialty.

Celebrating 45 Years of Commitment to the Future of Dermatology

The Dermatology Foundation celebrated a significant milestone in 2009—its 45th anniversary. Since its start in 1964, growth and stability have been hallmarks of the Dermatology Foundation. From its modest beginnings, the DF's annual research funding has risen steadily—a hundredfold since its first 6 grants of \$5,000 were awarded in 1967. To date, the Foundation has bestowed nearly 1,800 career development awards, fellowships, and research grants, and has invested \$60 million in the specialty. Its Research Endowment Fund, the Foundation's savings for future funding needs, now totals \$15.5 million.

\$3 Million for Research

Despite the nation's economic difficulties, members and other supporters have continued to invest wisely in the DF, maintaining a bright future for the specialty. Individual and industry contributions in 2009 enabled the Foundation to award a total of \$3 million among 65 promising physician-scientists and investigators in support of projects that range across the spectrum of dermatology.

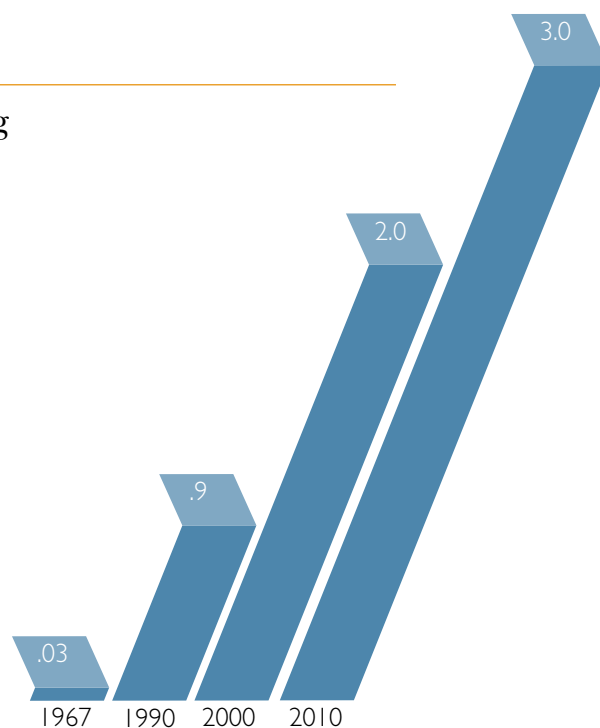
Unyielding Member Support

The Foundation's greatest supporters continue to be individual members. In 2009, \$3.1 million was donated by members who know personally how important research is to the future of their specialty. In a year when philanthropic giving was devastated, this sum, down less than three percent (3%) from 2008, demonstrates how crucial members know the work of the DF to be.

The largest percentage of the year's individual giving total came from those participating at a leadership level: the DF's Thomas B. Fitzpatrick Legacy Fund, Annenberg Circle, AC Sustaining and Leaders Society members. The 11 members of the Fitzpatrick Fund provided nearly six percent of the total of member contributions and more than half came from the DF's Leaders Society.

in millions of dollars

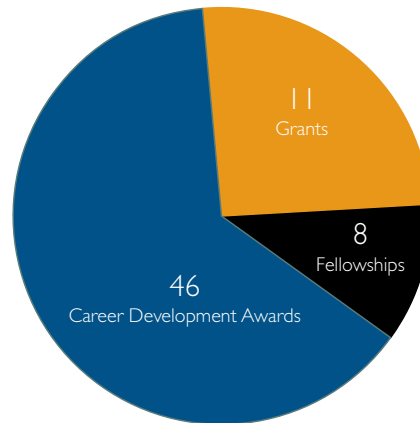

2010 Research Awards

DF research funding is provided through career development awards (CDA), fellowships and grants. The year 2009 marked another key event—the 20th anniversary of the career development award—the most effective investment the Foundation can make in the specialty. The Trustees are pleased to report that a total of 46 CDAs were bestowed, in addition to eight fellowships and 11 research grants.

Like most sectors of the nation's economy, the organizations that support the Foundation's work have also experienced a downturn. Despite the unfavorable financial climate, industry and specialty societies provided \$2.9 million in support of the DF's mission.

The pinnacle of this support was occupied by **Galderma** and **Unilever**, Cornerstone Benefactors, who each contributed \$500,000.

The DF—A “Significant Force in the Specialty”

When the DF was established in 1964, there were few departments of dermatology, limited research progress and a lack of full-time dermatologists at many major medical centers. It was then that a group of ten forward-thinking dermatologists and scientists formed the Dermatology Foundation to further the specialty by providing grants for basic training in dermatologic research. Dr. Eugene Van Scott, one of the ten founders, recalls the DF’s start and has witnessed its evolution to its current role—a critical resource for the advancement of dermatology.

For Dr. Van Scott, the Dermatology Foundation actually came into being on the day that his good friend Dr. Thomas B. Fitzpatrick came to meet with him at the National Insti-

tutes of Health (NIH). He was Chief of the NIH Dermatology Branch at that time. Dr. Fitzpatrick was chair of Harvard’s Department of Dermatology, and arrived at the NIH with his research colleague Irving Blank, PhD.

“They came to discuss Tom’s concept for a new organization in dermatology,” Dr. Van Scott recounts. “Tom had the foresight to realize that the welfare and future of dermatology depended upon good research, and the increasingly stiff competition for NIH funds had come to worry him a great deal. He felt that dermatology had to assure its own future, and he and Irv talked about a foundation that would be supported by dermatologists because it was in their best interest.”

They convinced Donald M. Pillsbury, MD, head of Dermatology at the University of Pennsylvania and one of the most respected members of the specialty, to lead this new foundation. When the DF became a formal entity in 1964, six more visionary dermatologists had joined as founders: Herman Beerman, MD, Robert R. Kierland, MD, Clarence S. Livingood, MD, J. Lowry Miller, MD, Wiley M. Sams, MD, and Marion B. Sulzberger, MD.

Dr. Van Scott recalls that the DF’s first years were that of a small start-up organization. “It took some time before it raised the funds needed to have a substantial impact,” he says. “And then it emerged with voltage and energy as a significant force in the specialty.” He emphasizes that “critical to this success was its volunteer leadership. Their long-term commitment to the DF’s mission enabled the Foundation to evolve and flourish. As a result, “the DF attracted inventive, research-minded young people to the specialty—who in turn have become the leaders, innovative investigators and teachers of today.”

In the early 1960’s, “dermatology was really trivialized by medicine,” Dr. Van Scott remembers. “Donald Pillsbury was convinced that the country needed only a dozen or so departments and now there are over 100.” Today, dermatology is center stage. He characterizes the role the Foundation played in the specialty’s transformation as “immense.” The DF “has succeeded in supporting not only basic research, but in drawing more physician–scientists to research.” Because their investigations are the bridge enabling basic research discoveries to reach patient care, “the physician–researcher is especially important” he notes.

Looking ahead, Dr. Van Scott sees the DF continuing to play a critical part in the growth of the specialty. “Fundamental research on the frontiers of science is so important to the overall interest of the specialty—and that is what must keep going. Continually meeting this challenge is what lies ahead—for the specialty and its Foundation.”

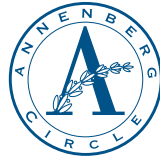

The Role of Toll-Like Receptors in Psoriasis



Psoriasis is a common chronic skin disease, with a significant impact on patients’ lives. The cause of psoriasis is not yet understood, but it may be a response to parts of bacteria. This study will try

to determine what the normal response is to these molecules and if that response is different in psoriasis. The results of this study may lead to better treatments.

The Influence of the Cytokine Network in Psoriasis on Clinical Phenotype and Treatment Response



Cytokines are the key communicators between the cellular drivers of psoriasis. Variation in this complex signaling network is likely to be responsible for the different clinical presentations and the lack of

response or worsening disease sometimes observed with targeted therapies. In this study we will examine and characterize these signaling interactions, and determine whether they can predict clinical presentation and, most important, response to treatment.

Mechanisms of Peripheral T-Cell Tolerance to Epidermal Self-Antigen



Bullous pemphigoid, pemphigus vulgaris, vitiligo, alopecia areata and cutaneous lupus are severe skin diseases that are characterized by abnormal immune responses directed against normal skin (i.e.,

autoimmunity). The focus of this study is to better understand how and why the immune system decides to attack normal skin. This work has the potential to uncover new therapies for people suffering from autoimmune skin diseases.

Investigation of the Role of Soluble Adenylyl Cyclase in Psoriasis Pathogenesis



A novel signaling molecule, soluble adenylyl cyclase (sAC), plays a putative role in the pathogenesis of hyper-proliferative skin diseases such as psoriasis, skin cancer, and warts. This research will use sAC

inhibitors to help to establish the importance of sAC in the development of psoriasis and lead to a better understanding of the development of psoriasis and to the development of novel drugs for treating psoriasis.

Merkel Cell Carcinoma Pathogenesis: Clues from Keratins?



Merkel cell carcinoma (MCC) is an aggressive skin cancer with a higher overall mortality than melanoma. To gain clues into potentially reversible changes that may play a role in tumor development, the recipient

will study the abnormal aggregation of keratin 20 protein into clumps that occurs in MCC tumor cells. He will also test whether the recently discovered Merkel cell virus can contribute to MCC development by causing keratin clumping.

Protective Effects of Dermal Rejuvenation on Photocarcinogenesis



A major risk factor for developing nonmelanoma skin cancer is exposure to ultraviolet sunlight rays combined with aging. While growth factors in the skin are protective against the development of skin

cancers, these factors are reduced with aging. In this study, rejuvenating skin laser treatments will be used to help restore these important growth factors, and thereby protect against skin cancer development.

Disparities in the Incidence of Late Stage Melanoma: The Impact of Race, Ethnicity, and Poverty



Melanoma is often diagnosed later among Hispanics and African-Americans, when the cure rate is much lower. This is an especially increasing problem in Florida, where the melanoma rate is

particularly high and the Hispanic population is large. This study will look at how race/ethnicity, insurance status, and socioeconomic environment (i.e., where one lives) affect melanoma detection, and identify Florida communities with high concentrations of advanced melanoma for further study.

Molecular Mechanisms of Hair Follicle Induction



This study seeks to dissect out the molecular cues required for human hair follicle induction. With aging, hair follicles miniaturize and are less capable of growing large hairs. Completion of the project aims should

enable us to analyze exciting new ways to induce hair growth and revolutionize treatments in cosmetic dermatology.

The Use of Inpatient Dermatology Consultations to Reduce Antibiotic Use for "Pseudo-Cellulitis"



Cellulitis is a common skin infection. When cellulitis is severe and requires hospitalization, antibiotics are given by injection into the blood. Many other skin conditions, such as allergic reactions, can resemble

cellulitis but do not require aggressive antibiotics to improve. Dermatologists are best able to distinguish these other conditions from cellulitis. This study will determine if having dermatologists evaluate patients hospitalized for cellulitis decreases unnecessary antibiotic use.

Cutaneous Manifestations of Polycystic Ovary Syndrome



Polycystic ovary syndrome (PCOS) is a complex hormonal disease of women that risks infertility and potentially fatal complications, including heart attacks and cancer, if untreated.

Dermatologists play an important role in its diagnosis, as numerous skin findings are associated with this disorder. This study seeks to further the understanding of skin disease in PCOS to improve prediction of who has this disease, enabling early treatment to be implemented.

Plakophilins Organize Structural and Signaling Cues Regulating Tissue Development and Homeostasis



The integrity of the outer layer of skin, the epidermis, requires firm attachment between epidermal cells and between the epidermis and underlying dermis. The goal of this study is to understand how a family of

proteins, the plakophilins, coordinates these attachments. Understanding how plakophilins regulate these epidermal adhesions will give insight into the mechanisms behind skin diseases resulting from a loss of those attachments.

Defining the Autoimmune Response in Vitiligo



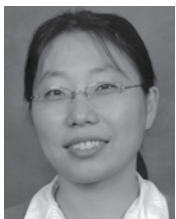
Vitiligo is an autoimmune disease causing patchy loss of pigment in the skin that affects 1–2% of the population. Emerging imaging techniques will be used to visualize the skin of live mice with vitiligo and,

using 3-D technology, immune cells will be observed as they attack pigment-making cells. Using these data, we will test mechanisms to block the movement of these immune cells and the interactions that enable them to mediate disease.

Pathomechanisms and Treatment of PXE



Pseudoxanthoma elasticum (PXE) is an inherited multi-system disorder characterized by dystrophic mineralization of soft connective tissues, including the skin, eyes, and arterial blood vessels. PXE is caused

by mutations in the *ABCC6* gene. The mechanisms leading to the mineralization caused by loss-of-function mutations in this gene are not clear. There is no specific and effective treatment for this disease. The *GGCX* gene has been demonstrated to be a modifier gene of PXE.

This study will use a mouse model to investigate a deficiency of this gene on the mineralization process and evaluate preclinical therapeutic tests for treatment of PXE. The findings from this project have the potential to further the understanding of the pathomechanisms of PXE as well as the development of treatment modalities.

Skin Stem Cell Fate Maintenance and Lineage Determination



Adult stem cells have the ability to self-renew as well as to differentiate into particular cell types. Cancer cells often display many characteristics of stem cells, and recent evidence suggests that cancerous cells

might arise from somatic stem cell origin. This study aims to understand the mechanisms underlying how stem cells self-renew, proliferate, and differentiate. These results will be important to the potential therapeutic use of stem cells for tissue repair and regeneration as well as improved diagnoses and treatment for cancer.

Role of CRD-BP in Basal Cell Carcinoma Development



A new mechanism leading to the stimulation of expression and activity of the protein GLII has been identified. Because GLII is important for the development of the most common skin cancer, i.e., basal cell

carcinoma (BCC), the study will examine whether this newly discovered mechanism is important in BCC development. If it is, this would be significant for developing new ways of treating BCC and reducing the associated cost of care.

Role of Dendritic Cells in Immunity to Melanoma Mediated by Anti-TRP1 Antibody + Cyclophosphamide



Anti-tyrosinase related protein 1 antibody (anti-TRP1) is a promising new anti-melanoma treatment. It was recently discovered that anti-TRP1 works best together with cyclophosphamide

chemotherapy, and that in combination these agents activate immune cells against the tumor. Dendritic cells are key activators of the immune system. This study aims to define the role dendritic cells play in activating the immune system to clear tumors during this combination therapy.

Molecular Basis of Merkel Cell Carcinoma



Merkel cell carcinoma (MCC) is a rare but aggressive and lethal cancer of the skin, associated with the elderly, chronic sun damage and/or immunosuppression. While the pathogenesis of MCC is

poorly understood, many of these tumors have recently been shown to contain a novel Merkel cell polyomavirus (MCV). These experiments will test the hypothesis that this MCV plays a functional role in MCC development.

Developing New Therapeutic Approaches to Cure Harlequin Ichthyosis in an *ABCA12* Mutant Mouse Model



Harlequin ichthyosis (HI) is a devastating congenital skin disease caused by mutations in the *ABCA12* gene. Few patients can survive to adulthood due to severe skin defects and the lack of effective treatments. Using a

pre-clinical HI mouse model, this study will test the feasibility of a new topical treatment for ameliorating the pronounced thick skin symptom, as well as two novel genetic approaches to repairing *ABCA12* mutations to cure the disease.

Cutaneous Vaccination: The Pre-Clinical Use of Flt3L as an HIV Vaccine Adjuvant to Expand Skin DCs



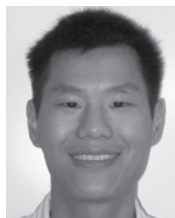
The skin functions as an organ of immune protection, defending the host from foreign invaders including viruses. Important immune cells reside in the skin. The dendritic cell is considered the master regulator cell,

educating T cells to what is self and non-self, and thus should not or should elicit an immune response. In this project, the lab will uniquely target a vaccine to dendritic cells and investigate the use of the drug Flt3L to expand different skin dendritic cell populations in order to improve a current HIV vaccine.

Epigenetics of Melanoma



Epigenetics is the alteration of gene expression without a change in DNA sequence. There are many open questions regarding the role in the development of malignancies, such as melanoma, played by

aberrant epigenetic chemical modifications to DNA or by DNA packaging proteins. Using novel sequencing technologies, this study seeks to delineate these modifications in melanoma and further understand their role in the development of melanoma.

Genetic Screen for Tumor Suppressors in Mouse Skin Using PiggyBac Transposon Mutagenesis



This study will use a novel technology, the PiggyBac transposon, to develop a mouse model of skin cancer and subsequently screen these mice for genes that inhibit skin carcinogenesis.

Transposon insertional mutagenesis is a means of mutating and inactivating genes systematically, and this technology can create mice with selective inactivation of genes throughout the genome. In this project, screening these mice for tumors, indicating inactivated skin cancer inhibitors, should facilitate the discovery of novel tumor suppressor genes.

Antimicrobial and Wound Healing Impact of Nitric Oxide Releasing Nanoparticles in a Diabetes Model



Tiny microscopic capsules have been developed that can release nitric oxide, a gas that is involved in promoting wound healing over extended periods of time. This project seeks to exploit this new technology

to enhance the ability to correct poorly healing wounds and combat the physical and financial hardships associated with them. The study will show that this new technology can accelerate wound healing in uninfected/infected, diabetic/non-diabetic animal models.

Molecular Analysis of Spitzoid Neoplasms to Predict Malignant Behavior



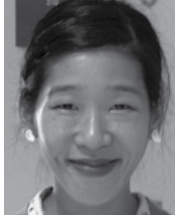
Spitz nevi are unusual moles present in children that under the microscope resemble melanoma. Most are actually benign but some prove to be malignant, and it can be impossible to tell the difference using current

diagnostic methods. This study seeks to employ genomic technologies to identify malignant lesions.

The Role of Dermal Wnt Signaling in Wound Healing and Hair Follicle Neogenesis



Hair follicles form by interactions communicated between the epithelium and underlying dermis during embryonic development, and infrequently during adult cutaneous wound healing.

Wnt signaling promotes the regeneration of many tissues and is active in the dermis during wound-induced hair regeneration, yet the requirement for dermal Wnt signaling during this process is unknown. The study will approach this question by regulating dermal Wnt signaling during wound-induced hair regeneration. These studies will lay the groundwork for developing novel clinical approaches to promote tissue regeneration and wound healing by modulating dermal signals.

Molecular Pathogenesis of Striae Gravidarum



Stretch marks related to pregnancy are common and distressing. Molecular mechanisms underlying their formation are poorly understood. This study will test the hypothesis that important causative factors

include physical stretch and alterations in the connective tissue of skin. It will also investigate how such factors impact the function of specialized skin cells called fibroblasts, with the goal of ultimately translating research findings into tailored therapies.

Fellowship in Pediatric Dermatology

Recipients of this award are clinical scholars in pediatric dermatology and will advance the sub-specialty through patient care, research, and teaching. The Society for Pediatric Dermatology partners with the DF to fund this \$45,000 single year fellowship.

Genetic Basis of Hemangiomas



Infantile hemangiomas are the most common tumor of childhood, yet very little is known about their pathogenesis. This project is a family-based genome-wide association study to identify genes associated with

hemangioma development. The data generated will be used to perform functional studies on these genes and correlate genetic variants with clinical phenotype, risk of complication, and treatment outcomes.

DF-funded research grants provide \$20,000 for the non-salary components of a research project. A variety of research grants are funded each year to support medical and surgical dermatologic studies as well as basic science research that will benefit the dermatologic community at large. A special \$10,000 program development grant is available to further the infrastructure of a division or department of dermatology.

Nominated by their peers, three such specialty leaders were honored by the Foundation at its Annual Meeting of Membership in Miami, Florida. The Trustees offer congratulations to the 2009 honorary awardees.

2009 Lifetime Career Educator Award

O. Fred Miller, III, M.D.



This award honors the specialty's great educators—the dedicated full-time academic dermatologists who have graciously imparted knowledge to many generations of residents and fellows.

For nearly 40 years, Dr. O. Fred Miller has inspired residents and faculty of the Department of Dermatology at the Geisinger Medical Center in Danville,

Pennsylvania. As director for almost 30 of those years, he has trained more than 70 residents, mentored more than a dozen faculty, authored more than 40 publications and made many hundreds of presentations on dermatology in local, national, and international settings. In 2008, Dr. Miller was named Dermatologist of the Year in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

“Not only is he an extraordinary teacher”, says Victor J. Marks, M.D., Dr. Miller also “possesses a legendary ability to connect personally with patients. People feel a special bond to this unusual physician because of his uncanny ability to connect with them as individuals and to treat their conditions within the context of their particular lives. He teaches them what they

He completed his dermatology residency at Geisinger and joined the faculty there in 1971 after military service in West Germany, ultimately directing the Residency Program. He was Department Director from 1978 to 2006, and until recently, headed the Wound Clinic. He continues to head the Melanoma Clinic, and notes with interest how dermatology “crosses over with so many other specialties.” For example, wound care, a significant interest of his, interacts with orthopedics and vascular surgery, while melanoma interacts with oncologic surgery and oncology.

“Education has always been very important to me,” Dr. Miller says. He believes constant teaching and dialogue provides the best patient care as well as the

2009 Practitioner of the Year Award

Diane R. Baker, M.D.



This prestigious award recognizes dermatologists who demonstrate exemplary service as a practitioner, committed to the highest levels of clinical care.

Dr. Diane Baker practices in Portland, Oregon and cannot imagine a specialty more satisfying than dermatology. She strives to provide state of the art care for her patients who present to her with the great variety of conditions that all dermatologists see daily. The fact that the practice of dermatology combines both medical and surgical skills is what convinced Dr. Baker to accept the residency offered her by the chairman of the dermatology department at the University of Wisconsin, Madison, in 1971—that, and the enthusiasm for the specialty that she saw in her fellow dermatology residents.

After two years of residency at Wisconsin, Dr. Baker moved to Portland, Oregon with her husband, Dr. James Baker, a pedia-

tric allergist, and completed her residency and a year of research fellowship at Oregon Health and Science University (OHSU). In the years since then, her work with the clinical faculty of the Department of Dermatology at OHSU and her private practice have both been sources of great satisfaction.

Dr. Baker’s general dermatology practice has evolved over the years to include a subspecialty in cosmetic dermatology as well as a robust clinical trials practice. “My patients were the impetus for adding cosmetic procedures to my practice, starting with pa-

Sidney Barsky, M.D.



For almost 40 years, this annual award has recognized the often unheralded dermatologists who give so generously of their time and expertise as part-time teachers and practitioners.

Now in the tenth decade of his life, Dr. Sidney Barsky has been a practicing dermatologist since 1950, and is a well-known and respected member of the teaching community in the Chicago area. He continues to be a prime exemplar of the private practitioner who also serves the specialty as an outstanding part-time teacher. His passion for dermatology began in childhood. His mother suffered with chronic stasis dermatitis, and, he recalls, “I used to see doctors coming to our house and taking care of her. I was awed by their knowledge and their ability to help people—that got me interested in medicine.”

After graduation from the University of Illinois Medical School, he interned at Chicago’s Cook County Hospital in 1944.

He then spent two years as a medical officer in the U.S. Army, followed by a one-year dermatology fellowship at the Cook County Hospital Graduate School of Medicine.

At the same time that he entered private practice, Dr. Barsky decided he also wanted to contribute to the specialty by teaching: “I wanted to give something back and maintain a connection with academics.” Ultimately, he became Clinical Professor of Dermatology at the University of Illinois and Chairman of the Division of Dermatology at Cook County Hospital. After retiring from both positions in 1986, he went into private practice in

long career, he has received several honors for his contributions to dermatology, including the Chicago Dermatological Society’s Gold Medal Award for a lifetime of outstanding service and academic excellence. His enthusiasm for his field inspired two children who followed in his footsteps and are both practicing dermatologists.
